## Cohabitation episodes

## INFOBOX

Questions 14 to 19 are about cohabitation episodes of the respondent with their current partner. Z stands for the $z$-th cohabitation episode, sd7ez indicates whether the respondent lives together with their current partner. In sd8ezb and sd9eze, the beginning and the end of this cohabitation episode are recorded. The wording for the first episode is different from that for subsequent episodes (see questions 14,16 and 19 as well as questions 15 and 17).
The current cohabitation episode is documented first. If the respondent mentions currently living together with the partner, the starting point but not the ending point of this cohabitation episode is asked for, since it is still ongoing. Consequently, the variables sd8e1e_ do not exist. If the respondent lived together with their partner in the past but not at present, no first cohabitation period ( $z=1$ ) exists. Past cohabitation periods are recorded in higher-level cohabitation episodes ( $z>1$ ).
