#### INFOBOX

The progression of the calendar is illustrated using screenshots to capture screen displays or input boxes that appear during the interview. The progression of the screenshots in the documentation corresponds to the progression of the screen displays during the interview, whereby the interviewer can always go back to earlier screen displays and input boxes in order to change entries. The following additional information is placed to the left of the screenshots:

- 1. Input: Preload variables that determine what is displayed on-screen.
- 2. Output: Variables determined by the entries in the input boxes shown on the screen display.
- 3. Filter: Information regarding which respondents see the screen displays or input boxes.
- 4. Text blocks: Text elements that are shown according to the various filtering conditions.
- 5. Presentation: Explanation regarding how available information is presented on the calendar.
- 6. Buttons: Explanation of the function of buttons.
