Respondent groups

Three groups of respondents are posed further questions beyond the standard question program:

Former CAPI children are the children of other anchor respondents who previously participated in the children's CAPI survey and are now interviewed every year as anchor respondents themselves.

First-time respondents are former CAPI children who are participating in the current wave for the first time as anchor respondents.

Refreshment sample respondents belong to the group of respondents part of a new sampling who are being interviewed for the first time in Wave 11 of the pairfam panel.




